ENTRY REQUIREMENTS & CRITERIA

- Select an Art Institutes school you would like to attend.
- You must be a high school senior graduating in 2010 and a member of the National Art Honor Society.
- Submit six slides of six different original pieces of artwork that represent your creative ability and interest. Digital files may be submitted in lieu of slides.
- Submit a written statement describing your artistic career goals and why you want to be considered for a scholarship.
- Submit your name, home address, and phone number; school name, address, phone number; and name of your National Art Honor Society advisor.
- To validate the scholarship, winners must apply and be accepted to The Art Institutes school of their choice. Upon receipt, all submissions become the sole property of The Art Institutes and will not be returned.

NATIONAL FCCLA CULINARY COMPETITION

First-place team winners of the National FCCLA Culinary Competition will be awarded a \$3,000 tuition scholarship to any one of over 30 U.S. schools comprising The International Culinary Schools at The Art Institutes. A \$2,000 tuition scholarship for second place and a \$1,000 tuition scholarship for third place will also be awarded to the teams.*

NATIONAL FCCLA FASHION DESIGN AND FASHION CONSTRUCTION COMPETITION

First-place winners of the National FCCLA Fashion Design and Fashion Construction Competitions will be awarded a **\$3,000** tuition scholarship to any one of The Art Institutes offering a Fashion program in the U.S. A **\$2,000** tuition scholarship for second place and a \$1,000 tuition scholarship for third place will also be awarded in each competition.*

NATIONAL FCCLA INTERIOR DESIGN COMPETITION

First-place winners (either team or individual) of the National FCCLA Interior Design Competition will be awarded a **\$3,000** tuition scholarship to any one of The Art Institutes in the U.S. offering the Interior Design program. A **\$2,000** tuition scholarship for second place and a **\$1,000** tuition scholarship for third place will also be awarded (either team or individual). Applicants must be seniors graduating in the competing year to be eligible for the scholarship.*

PROSTART (ADVANCE PLACEMENT CREDITS)

Students who complete the ProStart® program with a C average or above and obtain a certificate of completion may receive advance placement credit at any of over 30 U.S. schools of The International Culinary Schools at The Art Institutes. Advance Placement rewards students for their skills, saving them time and money.

Students may receive academic credit up to 12 credits (valued at over \$5,000) for any combination of the following programs:

- Safety and Sanitation with ServSafe® Food Safety certificate
- Elective; Externship; Management, Supervision, and Career Development; Culinary Nutrition**
- Work Experience Credit reviewed by local school's Chef Director and Dean of Academic Affairs on a case-by-case basis

** Some restrictions apply for approval of Culinary Nutrition credits. See local school for details. Additional credits may be articulated to ProStart® students on a case-by-case basis upon review by the local school's Chef Director and Dean of Academic Affairs.

PROSTART INVITATIONAL

First-place winners of the National ProStart® Invitational Culinary Competition and Management Competition will be awarded a \$3,000 tuition scholarship to any one of over 30 U.S. schools comprising The International Culinary Schools at The Art Institutes. A \$2,000 tuition scholarship for second place and a \$1,000 tuition scholarship for third place will also be awarded.
